



Kingdom Values for Trying Times

TRUSTEES' REPORT

The Trustees would like to give a big "THANK YOU" to everyone that came to a "Labors of Love" event that was held on March 16th. A much needed cleaning of the Sanctuary, Parlor, Fellowship Hall and Kitchen was performed in preparation for Holy Week and Easter.

The Church Council has approved a plan presented by the Trustees for the removal of failing asbestos floor tiles in the second floor Recreation Room. The cost for the abatement portion of the project is \$8,400.00. The abatement portion of the project will take place on June 26 & 27, following the conclusion of Summer Camp on June 21 st.

We are also kindly requesting the aid of several able bodied folks on Saturday June 22nd to help relocate all the furniture, game tables, etc. in the Recreation Room, into the gym prior to the start of the project on June 26th.

Bids are currently being secured for different replacement flooring options. We would like to offer our grateful thanks to Nora Edens for her vision, input and time in helping secure bids for this project. The use of the Recreation Room is vital for us to be able to help accommodate Scout programs and after school programs that are now unable to use any basement rooms until the basement rehab can commence.

Donations for this ongoing project would be greatly appreciated.

We will be holding another "Labors of Love" event in early May prior to our Anniversary Celebration. Watch for more info in forthcoming Eden E News.


FINANCIAL STATUS/PROCESSES UPDATE

We're in transition on leadership and tools --both! Since David Angel's relocation and final report in January, we've been attending to a slow and smooth transition to a next treasurer (hopefully in June).

In the meantime, staff and other signers have processed bills and revenue in a timely manner. Sarah has led the processes of switching to a more affordable and church/ customer service oriented payroll vendor called MinistryWorks. We're also migrating our bookkeeping to a more user-friendly software tool called OneChurch. The tasks of the ideal financial officer(s) have been well documented so that the nominating committee can explore options of a possible team approach to these duties, should this be a direction we are led.

MANNA FOR THE MOMENT

The New Testament parallel to the "one day at a time" trust exercise God creates in the Old Testament wilderness - with the daily appearance (and disappearance) of manna -is the miracle of the loaves and fishes found in the Gospels. Yes, I wrote about that AGAIN in the Eden e-blast last week.

Why? Because, as I shared there, I often say to my clergy friends about Eden: "Every day is a loaves and fishes day." That is, a chance to trust, lean forward, sit, pray and eat in the presence of what seems "not enough."

Last week the trustees held a visioning-prioritizing meeting in advance of our Second Century Appeal for the upcoming anniversary, and prioritized a multi-year plan for attending to our most pressing building needs. It's tens and tens of thousands of dollars.

In addition, we learned the same week that our annual insurance costs will be increased BY 9,000.00 starting June 1. As we deal with these challenges, we want you to know that we're constantly looking for places to reduce costs for frugality and increase revenue from our members, friends, and space-sharers. This will be a daunting challenge.

Readers of the *Echo are deeply devoted to this ministry, whether or not regularly present in body or spirit. We ask you to pray about your current regular giving, and to accept the Divine challenge to step forward with gifts however small or large in these challenging days.*

GRANT TEAM UPDATE

The Grant Oversight Team will soon hold its quarterly meeting, to assess how our grant-funded outreach programs are going and potential additional reporting and requests to work on. We anticipate receiving a second year of funding for In Good Company weekly programs of meal-based dialogue, learning and worship. We're also completing a request for ReKindle (funded previously in 2022-2023), from Columbia Theologicall Seminary. We will learn in June if our LOI to Partners for Sacred Spaces results in an invitation to apply for funds which would be used to rehab the basement and restore it to use. It remains closed to activities until we raise the funds to repair the foundation cracks and address abatement and mold remediation issues.


