


#### KINGDOM VALUES FOR TRYING TIMES

There, we are reminded that "kingdom power for change" looks like patience (not passivity), long steady growth of small things (mustard seeds) into larger impactful things (sheltering trees or invasive weeds) and yeast which must disappear in and mingle with other ingredients in order to make real *nourishing bread*.

COMMUNITY CONVERSATIONS


Held 11:30am-12pm each Communion Sunday

# "KEEPING THE HIGH WATCH" --- Celebrating, Connecting, Completing in 2024

"Keeping the watch" is a phrase from the Biblical book of Habakkuk which inspired and anchored me throughout 2023. I shared on this theme as I presented my pastoral report and reflection at our Annual Meeting on January 28. I felt this vibe alive in the whole fellowship that day, as we navigated the closure of one year and set course for the next. Each program report from others was Spirit-led, with a realism and a reach for whatever God has next for us.\* We started some visioning and feedback activities that have been carried through new Community Conversations. We especially treasured the Treasurer! David Angel shared his final report with us, along with perspective and encouragement worthy of the charge to "keep the high watch."



I'm still journeying with all that it means to me personally, but it surely involves a call to stay focused on God's character, the sufficiency of God's grace, Christ's redemption and our clear mandates and values in a changing and difficult world. To stay "prayed up" and in the right study and companionship so that I might stay objective and empathic in the present, and keep my "eyes on the prize" for a long-term perspective (that's Apostle Paul in Philippians 3). Focus, but with a faith horizon! Keeping past, present and future in right relationship in my mind. This is the spirit with which I invited us to think about 2024 in terms of the 3C's --

#### BRIDGING JEFFERSON PARK MEETINGS Monthly Gatherings Began in January

We have rebooted the important coalition project entitled "Bridging Jeff Park" with monthly meetings in January and February. This is an organization that we initially convened in 2019 with the goal of pulling together the different organizations already working in the neighborhood to learn more about our history as a community and think about how we could work together on the current troubles our community is facing.

More than 15 people from the neighborhood have gathered for a time of fellowship and planning for the upcoming year. Many shared the vision of continuing to make our work intergenerational—reaching out to seniors and youth as we look at how we can aid our unhoused neighbors as well as our newest neighbors from around the world. We are just beginning again in this work, but already there is excellent energy toward this work and the possibilities that the new year brings. Please keep an eye out for updates and enhancements if you are interested in joining us!

Our next meeting will be Tuesday, March 19th. Dinner opens at 6pm; meeting will follow 6:30-7:30pm.

#### EDEN SUPPORTS UNHOUSED NEIGHBORS

As mentioned in the above article, the Bridging Jeff Park project includes a current emphasis on wise support of the long-term unhoused and recent migrants. As of the Fall, Eden now houses funds - under the BJP project -- to assist our unhoused neighbors. At present, these funds total a little more than \$6000, which will be used for staff coordination, supplies, hospitality, education. A 2024-2025 plan and budget will be the topic of the March 19th meeting.

#### **GRANT TEAM UPDATE**

We've received and utilized more than ten grants over the last seven years! Thanks to Katie Dahmer and David Angel, especially, for their long-term service on the "Grant Oversight Team." Also, to Pastor Hope Chernich for earlier years of service, and Sarah Foster's recent input. This team has worked with Pastor Jacki to discern which grants to seek, and the shape of program priorities which are a good and logical fit with our goals (and pace) of "inreach and outreach" to grow Eden's family.

We welcome your assistance in this endeavor, and The Trustees worked with Pastor recently to craft a Letter of Interest for a grant from Partners for Sacred Spaces. If we are invited to apply (and receive funds), these funds would be used for reclaiming the basement for use. It has been closed since January 2023 until we can complete foundation and tile repair, abatement, mold alleviation

> In March, we will be reporting and submitting a renewal request for "In Good Company" to support weekly intergenerational meal-based fellowship and learning opportunities. We are currently deciding on whether to apply for a second round of funds from ReKindle at Columbia Seminary, which supported our 2022-2023 "Embodying Sanctuary for a New Day" program which followed our rededication.


#### **S4 REPORT**



#### TREASURER TRANSITION UPDATE




## In Good Company: 110 Years of Growing Eden's Family MAY 17-19, 2024
